


Trip Itinerary

Wednesday, May 06: Depart Portland For Istanbul

Thursday, May 07: Arrive Istanbul – Fly to Cappadocia (Kayseri Airport)

Upon arrival to Kayseri Airport, drive to the hotel for dinner and overnight.



Friday, May 08: Cappadocia

After breakfast, a full day of sightseeing: You will visit Göreme where you will see remains of several hundred early churches, with rooms hollowed out of the cones of volcanic ash. Some of them are decorated with scratched frescoes depicting scenes from the Bible: drive through the Zelve valley on your way to Kaymaklý, an underground city which was an early Christian center that extended downward in the earth for at least eight floors and housed several thousand people in the eighth and ninth centuries; continue to Uçhisar, another early Christian community; hotel for dinner and overnight.

Saturday, May 09: Cappadocia – Konya – Antalya Drive to Iconium where Paul and Barnabas used the synagogue as their forum to address the local people. Continue to Antalya with a very scenic drive through the lakes and the rocky mountains. Dinner and overnight.

Sunday, May 10: Antalya

Visit to Perga, an ancient city even when Paul visited there. See the Perga Theater, the Agora Stadium, and the columned streets. Visit Aspendos, one of the best preserved theaters in the world, and Side where you will see the museum, theater, and temple. Dinner and overnight will be in the port city of Antalya.



Monday, May 11: Antalya – Myra – Board GULET (Wooden Yacht)

A breathtaking drive along the Mediterranean coast. Visit the ancient site of Myra, with its lovely Roman theater and Lycian tombs. Today Myra is best known as the city of St. Nicholas, where he served as bishop in the fourth century A.D. After visiting Myra we will embark our private GULET (wooden yacht) where we will spend 5 nights. Dinner on board.

Tuesday, May 12: Sail by Gulet to Simena – Kekova Visit Simena and see the ruins of the Sunken City. Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner on board.

Wednesday, May 13: Sail by Gulet to Kas Village – Xanthos – Patara

Leave the Gulet Boat at Kas Village. Visit to ancient Xanthos. Xanthos was ancient Lycia's largest and most important city. We'll then continue on to Patara, an ancient city visited by Paul (Acts 21:2) which features a beautiful theater and lighthouse. Dinner and overnight in Kalkan.



Thursday, May 14: Sail by Gulet to Kalkan – Gemiler Island

Hike up and see the ruins of the Byzantine Church at the island.

Friday, May 15: Sail by Gulet to Fethiye

Sail to Fethiye. Visit the ruins of Telmessos and Fethiye village. Overnight at Fethiye marina.

Saturday, May 16: Fethiye – Leave Gulet – Drive to Pamukkale

Leave Gulet boat and drive to Pamukkale, stopping in Colossae on the foothills of Mount Honaz. Continue to Laodicea, one of the Seven Churches of Revelation, and Hierapolis where you will visit the monuments, thermal baths and the theater with its well preserved stage and Temple of Apollo. Dinner and overnight will be in Pamukkale.



Sunday, May 17: Ephesus - Kusadasi

Drive to Ephesus, the first of the Seven Churches. You will see the amazing ruins of this great city: the theater, the library, the Temple of Hadrian and the newly excavated Roman Terrace Houses. Dinner and overnight.

Monday, May 18: Izmir Airport – Fly to Istanbul
Depart to Izmir Airport for flight to Istanbul. Arrive
at Istanbul Airport. Meet and transfer to the hotel.
Following a short orientation of Istanbul, we will take
a leisurely private boat tour along the Bosphorus,
the legendary waterway that connects the Black
Sea to the Mediterranean and divides Istanbul into
two continents, Asia and Europe. Once the capital
of two of the world's most important empires—the
Byzantine and the Ottoman—Istanbul represents the
best of both in its stunning monuments, architectural
wonders and world class museums. Following the

Bosphorus cruise we will stroll through the colorful spice bazaar—famous the world over for its exotic spices and sweets. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.



Tuesday, May 19: Byzantium – Constantinople – Istanbul

We explore the wonders of Istanbul. Beginning with the stunning, subterranean Basilica Cistern, we move on to the Golden Mile of the Egnatian Way, Hippodrome Square, and the breathtaking Blue Mosque as well as the magnificent, 1700-year-old Hagia Sophia. Afterwards, the Archaeological Museum—one of the most celebrated collections in the world. Among its treasures are the Siloam inscription, the Gezer calendar, and the stunning "Jerusalem mosaic" depicting Orpheus. Tonight, Farewell Dinner at a local restaurant.
